WHAT IS THIS GUIDE?

- This is an Academic Planning Guide, prepared by the Student Connect Centre to help you register for courses towards your desired program.
- If you are transferring to another institution to complete your degree, we strongly advise that you read the Academic Calendar of your destination institution for full information.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

- To successfully complete the Mount Royal University Bachelor of Business Administration - General Management Major at Red Deer Polytechnic, the student must:
 - Complete a minimum of twenty (20) required Co-Listed courses at RDP as described in Program Content.
 - Have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 over all courses required for graduation.Upon completion of the program, students will submit an application to graduate to Mount Royal University. Upon confirmation of graduation, students may attend convocation ceremonies at MRU and receive their parchment, and/or attend graduation ceremonies at RDP. MRU and RDP each requires fees for attendance at convocation.

WHAT IS A TERM? TERMS ARE THE PERIOD IN WHICH YOUR STUDIES TAKE PLACE. AT RDP, WE OFFER FOUR TERMS.

- **Fall term (September** through December)
- **Winter** term (January through April)
- **Spring** term (May through June): Spring term is an optional, condensed term. Course offerings are limited.
- **Summer** term (July through August): Summer term is an optional, condensed term. Course offerings are limited.

HOW MANY COURSES SHOULD I TAKE A TERM?

- The maximum number of courses you can take in the Fall or Winter terms is 5 courses and 2 courses in the Spring (optional).
- To complete your program in four years, you would need to take the maximum number of courses per term (5 courses in the Fall and 5 courses in the Winter), or 10 course per year. Some students will complete 10 courses in a year by taking 4 courses in the Fall, 4 courses in the Winter, and 2 courses in the Spring (or a combination thereof).
- We encourage you to find the best course load for you to be successful in your courses and your program!
- When determining your course load keep your funding in mind, if applicable. For course load requirements for funding purposes, please visit www.rdpolytech.ca/psfunding.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I TAKE LESS THAN 10 COURSES A YEAR?

- You may need an extra term or year to complete your program.

WHAT IF I COMPLETED COURSES AT ANOTHER POST-SECONDARY INSTITUTION?

Once you are admitted to RDP, you can then apply to have your post-secondary courses assessed for transfer credit through our [Recognition of Prior Learning Office](#). Once admitted to RDP you can complete an [RPL application form](#), provide the Polytechnic Assessors with any and all transcripts, course outlines/descriptions, or other documentation necessary to support your PLAR application.

- **NOTE:** To qualify for a Red Deer Polytechnic program credential, students must complete at least 50% of the credit requirements for the credential through enrolment in RDP courses.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Repeated Courses:	When a student presents the same course with more than one grade (i.e., the course has been repeated), the higher grade shall be used for evaluating purposes.
Coursework Expiration:	Normally there is no time limitation for the application of credit toward a Mount Royal University credential for any course completed at Mount Royal University or at any recognized accredited post-secondary institution. However, time limitations for individual courses may be imposed if the course content is particularly time sensitive. Any such time limitations must be approved by the Dean/Director of the appropriate faculty/school/centre upon recommendation from the Chair.
Spring Term Coursework:	Students must complete all degree requirements by the end of the winter term of their year of graduation to be able to participate in convocation. MRU conducts two convocation ceremonies per year - one in June and one in November (for any student that finishes in the spring semester).
Residency Requirement:	At least 50% of the course work required for a Mount Royal University parchment must be completed as Mount Royal coursework

Grading:	Credit will be considered only for those courses which have been completed with the minimum grade required for program continuance. If a program continuance is not stated, the minimum grade is 'D'. MRU will be using Years 3 & 4 coursework ONLY to calculate your graduation GPA (2.0 or Higher).
Graduation Requirement:	To successfully complete the Mount Royal University Bachelor of Business Administration, General Management Major at RDP, students must complete a minimum of 20 required courses; have a minimum GPA of 2.0 calculated on all courses required for graduation. Upon completion of the program, students will submit an application to Mount Royal University. Upon confirmation of graduation, students may attend convocation at Mount Royal and receive their parchment (payment of a convocation fee must be included with application) or students can attend convocation at RDP. Part-time students have up to 8 years to complete their program.
